SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL 2014**

The Security Council is expected to review the sanctions measures in April 2014.

### **Côte d'Ivoire – Group of Experts**

Resolution 2101 (2013) of 25 April 2013

Para.18: Decides to extend the mandate of the Group of Experts as set out in paragraph 7 of resolution 1727 (2006) until 30 April 2014 and requests the Secretary-General to take the necessary measures to support its action.

The Group of Experts mandate will expire on 30 April 2014.

### **Mali – MINUSMA**

Resolution 2100 (2013) of 25 April 2013

Para.34: Requests the Secretary-General to keep the Council regularly informed of the situation in Mali and the implementation of the mandate of MINUSMA, to report to the Council within 45 days of the adoption of this resolution, specifically with regards to paragraph 8 and 9 above, and then every three months from 1 July 2013 and to include in his reports to the Council updates on the security situation, the priority political elements as defined in paragraphs 1, 2, 3 and 4 above on the implementation of the transitional road map, relevant information on the progress, promotion and protection of human rights and international humanitarian law as well as a review of the troop level, force generation and deployment of all MINUSMA's constituent elements.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 1 April 2014.

### **Somalia – UNSOM**

Resolution 2102 (2013) of 2 May 2013

Para.14: Decides to review the mandate of UNSOM no later than 30 April 2014.

The Security Council is expected to review the UNSOM mandate in April 2014.

### **Somalia – Resolution 2142**

Resolution 2142 (2014) of 5 March 2014

Para 10: Requests the Secretary-



implementation of this resolution, challenges to MINURSO's operations and steps taken to address them, and expresses its intention to meet to receive and discuss his briefings and in this regard, further requests the Secretary-General to provide a report on the situation in Western Sahara well before the end of the mandate period.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2014.

## **ASIA/MIDDLE EAST**

### **The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question**

Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para.7: Invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

### **Middle East (Lebanon) – Resolution 1559 (2004)**

Resolution 1559 (2004) of 2 September 2004

Para.7: Requests that the Secretary-General report to the Security Council within thirty days on the implementation by the parties of this resolution and decides to remain actively seized of the matter.

S/PRST/2004/36 of 19 October 2004

Last para.: "The Security Council appreciates the Secretary-General's intention to keep the Council updated. It requests that he continue to report on the implementation of the resolution to the Council every six months."

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2014.

### **Middle East (Syria) – OPCW to report to SC (through SG) on implementation of resolution 2118 (2013)**

Resolution 2118 (2013) of 27 September 2013

Para.12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013.

The report dated 26 March 2014 (S/2014/220) is before the Council.

### **Middle East (Syria) – SG to report to SC on implementation of resolution 2139 (2014)**

Resolution 2139 (2014) of 22 February 2014

Para.17: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution by all parties in Syria, in particular paragraphs 2 through 12, in 30 days of its adoption

and every 30 days thereafter, and upon receipt of the Secretary-General's report, expresses its intent to take further steps in the case of non-compliance with this resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2014.

### **Middle East (Yemen) – Sanctions committee report to SC**

Resolution 2140 (2014) of 22 February 2014

Para.19: (e) To report within 60 days to the Security Council on its work and thereafter to report as deemed necessary by the Committee;

The Chair of the 2140 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council in April 2014.

## **EUROPE**

### **Resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) – UNMIK**

Resolution 1244 (1999) of 10 June 1999

Para.20: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council at regular intervals on the implementation of this resolution, including reports from the leaderships of the international civil and security presences, the first reports to be submitted within 30 days of the adoption of this resolution

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2014.

## **COUNTERTERRORISM/NON-PROLIFERATION**

### **Non-proliferation/DPRK – Panel of Experts mandate**

Resolution 2094 (2013) of 7 March 2013

Para.29: Recalls the creation, pursuant to paragraph 26 of resolution 1874 (2009), of a Panel of Experts, under the direction of the Committee, to carry out the tasks provided for by that paragraph, decides to extend until 7 April 2014 the Panel's mandate, as renewed by resolution 2050 (2012), decides further that this mandate shall apply with respect to the measures imposed in this resolution, expresses its intent to review the mandate and take appropriate action regarding further extension no later than twelve months from the adoption of this resolution, requests the Secretary- General to create a group of up to eight experts and to take the necessary administrative measures to this effect, and requests the Committee, in consultation with the Panel, to adjust the Panel's schedule of reporting.

The Group of Experts mandate will expire on 7 April 2014.

## **OTHER**

### **Women and peace and security – SG reporting**

Resolution 1960 (2010) of 16 December 2010

Para.18: requests that the Secretary-General continue to submit annual reports to the Council on the implementation of Resolutions 1820 (2008) and 1888 (2009) and to submit his next report by December 2011 on the implementation of Resolutions 1820 (2008) and 1888 (2009) and the present resolution to include, inter alia...:

Resolution 2106 (2013) of 24 June 2013

Para 22: Requests that the Secretary-General continue to submit annual reports to the Council on the implementation of women and peace and security resolutions and the present resolution, and to submit his next report by March 2014;

The report of the Secretary-General dated 12 March 2014 (S/2014/181) is before the Council.
