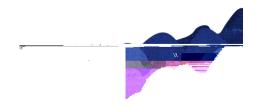




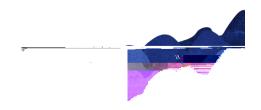








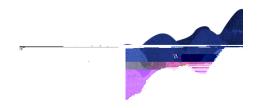
INTRODUCTION

Young persons with disabilities with multiple intersectional identities , including LGBTIQ+ youth, armed conflict survivors, refugees, young indigenous people, and young women and girls , face unique challenges. These types of intersectional identities are often compounding, meaning young persons with disabilities are disproportionately impacted when it comes to issues of access and participation . For example, these challenges manifest themselves in terms of access to physical and psychosocial safety, the ability to exercise bodily autonomy, safe access to a toilet and a lack of access to an education. Many stakeholders are still struggling with realization of disability rights, thus intersectional issues often remain invisible. Young persons with disabilities experience being treated as naïve because of their age while simultaneously being treated as incapable or burdensome because of their disabilities .
